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

DESIGN

The fixed stools that adorn the decorative bar are themselves upholstered with an eye-catching material.

Kravet Donahue is an excellent embossed faux leather range with a textured botanical pattern. Suitable for contract use when upholstered over an interliner, Donahue 606 used here features on our Bolt Cast Iron bar stool. Other upholstery details include the pink poufs, which are fully upholstered in Sacho Balboa Colour 009, with piping 80 mm from the top fringe in Samuel & Sons 3" Richmond fine bullion fringe 9.

INTRICATE CUSTOM-SIZED METALWORK WITH A QUICK TURNAROUND We supplied a number of turned metal bases with ornate details, such as our Lion Head bases and scroll leg bases which our in-house metalwork department were able to adapt to fit specific sized tops.

This project was turned around in under 6 weeks to meet the launch date, which is astounding considering the amount of customisation required. We were only able to achieve this due to our extensive in-house workshop facilities, thanks guys!

Andy Thornton has been supplying furniture, fixtures and fittings to pub interiors for over 45 years, so we had to include some classic British-made low pub stools, because a pub's not a pub without these little beauties. These stools have a solid beech frame stained to match 103 Dark Oak with added grain definition where possible and were upholstered in the extra classic Crest Old English, Dark Brown.

he Cadogan Arms is a muchloved Chelsea institution restored to its former glory with an ambitious renovation that pays homage to its Georgian heritage. But recreating a heritage interior that meets all the requirements of today's hospitality sector is not as easy

as buying in some antique furniture and sending a chimney sweep up the old fireplace. The secret to unlocking The Cadogan's interior charm lies in antiquing new contract furniture to make it look old.

For example, we took brand new raw beech Balloon chair frames and achieved an antique finish by applying two wood stains for tonal difference and then adding a patina to create the ageing. Unlike many upholstered antiques, this finished product now complies with UK hospitality fire regulations.

We supplied a number of turned wooden table bases in beech with a walnut stain, as well as Captain's armchairs with their turned details, and a specially developed Camacha bar stool which features two intricate front legs and two back legs with a gentle curve. This product was developed by taking the designer's inspiration image, and sourcing an existing side chair

we knew had a similar look. We then tweaked and elongated the frame before antiquing as with the Balloon chairs, for an end product everyone was delighted with.

















SKA

Ska is a Scandi-style collection with delightfully curved armrests. The chair is inspired in the natural world and designed to evoke calm and serenity as an antidote to the chaos of our modern lives. The ideas of simplicity, understated elegance and timelessness define the chair's design ethos.

The collection includes a side chair, armchair and bar stool; each has a solid beech frame and snugly upholstered seat and back.

The beech frame which can be polished to any colour and upholstered in any fabric or leather. Please note: the seat height of this bar stool is too high for home breakfast bars or worktops and cannot be shortened.

GILL

The Gill range boasts a set of sturdy wooden legs, blended into a robust yet contemporary design. The curved contrasting wooden panel on the backrest also adds visual intrigue by creating a double-shell effect.

The wooden legs which can be polished to any colour and can be upholstered in any fabric or leather.

The range consists of a side chair, armchair, lounge chair and bar stool.



ASPEN

Strong lines meet soft roundness in this contemporary collection of chairs with solid beech detail that wraps around the seat. The Aspen lounge chair features wooden legs which can be polished to any colour shown and can be upholstered in any fabric or leather.

The Umami armchair features a backrest made from two bentwood beech pieces that curve together and combine with the legs to create a slender frame. The upholstered seat is comfortable, the back intriguing as it's available upholstered, with a handwoven cane back, or two choices of woven rope in a spectrum of colours. The back material adds an artisanal element into the mix and when paired with the light frame, creates a truly contemporary chair.

The seat and back can be upholstered in any fabric or leather.



Beckworth
Emporium,
the lifestyle destination in
Northamptonshire UK, the challenge
was clear – How do we create
something newer, bigger and better

The original restaurant evolved over many years to win a place in customers' hearts and minds. The challenge was to capture the essence of this experience and instil this into every part of the interior and identity.

while retaining the unique experience

that loyal customers know and love?

The task was to significantly extend the glasshouse restaurant to accommodate over 400 customers, meeting the incredible demand from customers

Beckworth's biggest challenges were:

Space planning & layout; namely how to accommodate the new restaurant into the two huge glasshouse structures of 650 sq. meters - 7,000 sq feet, how to zone the space to make customers feel comfortable and easy. and then subsquently how to break up the vast space without compromising the function and aesthetics.

Operational challenges: queue management, Bar and Waiter stations – how to make the restaurant operationally manageable, how to ensure that staff can welcome, sit and serve all customers from the moment they enter the restaurant reception, been guided to the tables and being served efficiently. It was a huge design challenge to locate the bar and waiter stations around the building making staff journeys as short as possible, whilst keeping the connection with the kitchen and pot wash.

Ambience and comfort; we considered the lighting during the bright sunny days and dull dark afternoons, how to manage heat and ventilation, and making a visual connection between the glasshouse space and outside gardens.

It was important for us to ensure the impersonal glasshouse buildings have an identity, warm and cosy atmosphere and most importantly, reflect the values and personality of Beckworth Emporium.

HOW DO YOU CREATE PERSONAL DINING EXPERIENCES IN A LARGE SPACE WITHOUT IT FEELING LIKE A CANTEEN? The space was split into two separate buildings which were being combined via low central ceiling area. To create visually unified space, we designed a spine of two-sided banquette seating along the centre. This allows a physical break between the spaces, whilst retains a visual connection and customer flow through the restaurant. The use of both banquette and booth seating throughout the space helped us break the space in to separate and more intimate zones.

The two glasshouse buildings were further broken up with the introduction of large architectural structures to help bring a human scale to the space. Two metalwork shelters provide 'a room



within a room' offering more intimate dining areas/ events spaces.

The large U-shaped bar sits centrally in the restaurant, providing an efficient service hub and making it quick and easy to support for this busy restaurant. There is a matching metal canopy over the bar, providing height and space for lighting and greenery, whilst tying it in with two metalwork shelters in the other side of the restaurant.

ENSURING THERE'S NO 'BAD SEAT' IN THE RESTAURANT

Although being incredibly successful, the original restaurant and infrastructure was very dated, with operations extended over a long period of time. The key task was to build a new kitchen, warehouse facility to support the operational needs of Beckworth. The restaurant was extended to accommodate more seats and make a space to answer customer demand. We had to carefully consider the challenging operational needs, such as customer access, location for the reception desk, bar, waiter stations, kitchen, pot wash and customer toilets.

When designing the restaurant, we had to find a good balance between the customer needs i.e. provide space for intimate conversations and large family gatherings, afternoon teas and Christmas parties. By zoning the restaurant, adding separate architectural structures within the large glasshouse buildings, comfortable banquette



seating and private booths, areas with high bar tables and the zones with loose furniture, a good balance was achieved so that there is 'no bad seat' in this restaurant.

ACHIEVING BECKWORTH'S BRILLIANT BIOPHILIC DESIGN

Given the beautiful glazed nature of the building, right from the beginning we knew we wanted to create an inside/outside feel to the Restaurant, akin to orangeries and glasshouses of the past. We knew plants would be incredibly important to achieving this, and much of the detailing and design of the space was created with the use of plants in mind.

Once again, the challenge was the size of the space, using real plants over that scale involves an incredible amount of upkeep to keep it looking good. Plants being brushed past and even customers breath meaning plants don't look their best for long in that environment, so we decided with the client that a mixture of real and artificial plants would be best.

All large and small scale potted plants throughout the space are real, which gives the freedom to relocate and replace them to keep them looking their best. It was certainly important to us to have the real plants front and centre in the design, the Restaurant entrance sits next to the Emporium's house plant display, and overlooks the horticulture retail space so the potted plants help reinforce those offers.

We worked closely with Bright Green with the range of artificial plants used, as it was important to us to use plants of the correct scale for the space. An initial test scheme showed that anything with too small a leaf made the scheme feel very busy, so we went with larger leaf plants of varying shapes and colour tones and planted them in



groups. We limited the varieties used to create a scheme that could be used throughout the space to help tie all the areas together, but without being repetitive. We also ensured that the planting scheme was seasonless. The artificial plants sit in long troughs to add texture and a beautiful backdrop to the banquette seating and smaller troughs to break up the mid floor seating areas.

The two metalwork shelters and a canopy around the bar assisted to incorporate planting at high level. We have large hanging baskets with a range of large and small leaf trailing plants flanking the corners which really help break up the space.

FINDING THE PERFECT FABRIC

Finding the perfect pattern is always tricky as it can really change the feel of the space. The feel of the fabric, colours and design can really vary and it's impossible to tell from photos and supplier images. We compiled a huge range of samples to look at, mainly botanic fabrics, but also some patterns and geometric designs that evoked the feel of a garden in some way. The scale of the pattern was also a consideration, as we knew we were using along the roll top of the banquettes. Some of the fabrics we looked at were just too large, and the design would have been too abstract over that limited area.

As soon as we saw the Clarke&Clarke Passiflora fabric, we absolutely loved it, it had the perfect balance of a traditional botanic fabric with a modern twist and a luxury feel. The range of colourways allowed us to use two different versions in the space, with corresponding plains on the areas of the seats that would take the most wear. Customers constantly comment on the fabrics, and they really work beautifully in the space.

We have two banquette seats with a subtle trellis design behind. These incorporate climbing plants to break through the linearity, and large cropped three-dimensional logos in order to help brand the space. The effect is there with the trellis, but we deliberately didn't go rustic with the scheme - it's a very refined take on garden detailing. Likewise, the detailing on the metalwork shelters and external canopy is a subtle nod towards traditional Victorian glasshouses, without being overpowering.

A TALE OF TWO STUDENT UNIONS

FROM LONDON TO
STRATHCLYDE, BOTH THESE
STUDENT UNIONS USED OUR
VINTAGE FURNITURE RANGE
TO IMPRESS AND WITHSTAND,
FOR MAXIMUM IMPACT AND
HEAVY DUTY USE.

Replacing the much-loved old Strathclyde Student Union on John Street was always going to be difficult, but with over five years of development in close consultation with students, the new building is more student-friendly than ever.

Strath Union, as it is affectionately known has now moved to a new, repurposed building, which offers a more accessible experience with brand new facilities, from gender-neutral toilets, to baby changing and breastfeeding areas. The space is bright and airy, excellent in Covid times and beyond, and the capacity is bigger allowing students to spread out more comfortably.

MORE THAN JUST A STUDENT BAR

Over £60 million has been spent on developing the new learning and teaching building, which the new Strath Union is a part. Students now have the benefit of learning and socialising under one roof. The result is a spacious interior with a contemporary ambience and hints of industrial charm. With









many levels and rooms for every function, this multifaceted and multipurpose design has everything you'd expect from a union space and more There are bars, Roasters, the coffee shop and The Venue, an events space for everything from

live music to yoga. There are screens for showing football, 10 pool tables and darts booths, food outlets and even a media suite which aims to be the eyes and ears of the union and will feature student radio and podcasts in the days to come.







But beyond entertainment and socialising, there are quieter spaces, mindful of mental health, where students can relax, think and work.

IMPRESSIVE BESPOKE WORKSTATION UNITS WITH CHARGING SOCKETS

The building crucially offers the 23,000 students that attend the uni an additional space to study in, a change from the traditional library setting and a break from simply working in their accommodation. Outside the Roasters coffee shop we designed and supplied two table units for this purpose: 8.4m and 6.4m workspace units with sockets for charging. The tops are made from mango plank and the base is a steel frame, powder-coated black. We also manufactured Essen Workspace tables to create a large sharing table.

The main bar area continues with the industrial feel – we supplied our refectory style Providence tables and benches with their mango wood tops and black steel frames in a range of sizes from standard dining height to bespoke poseur tables and larger ones to match the areas. All were laid out with a range of our vintage stools as well as some fixed tables in the booths. It's not all industrial chic, part

of the design brief was to bring the outside in and attempt to replicate Glasgow in its sunnier months, rather than the rainy ones which make up most of the term time. To this end there are deck chairs, and picnic benches on Astro turf spaces that all make up part of The Terrace bar area.

DISTRESSED FINISHES ADD CHARACTER AND INCREASE FURNITURE LIFESPAN

The Vault in Kings' College London Student Union is a student bar, restaurant and nightclub. This multipurpose modern space with industrial inclinations provides a place for students to meet up, eat, relax and socialise from early until late.

The distressed vintage patinas, most notably the white finish on the Seaton and Trenton stools add character while simultaneously providing longevity. This is because scuff marks and other naturally occurring wear and tear from heavy contract use are much less noticeable with distressed patina.

In the same vein, the mango wood table tops and their roughhewn bandsawn appearance (which is actually smooth to the touch) will only become more characterful as they acquire additional marks from heavy student use. Mango wood is also a fantastic contract material because it's a fast-growing by-product of the fruit industry. This mean's it's both cheaper than other, more traditional table top materials, such as oak, is more sustainable and at the same time mango is also a hardwood so it's just as hardwearing.

ECLECTIC VINTAGE SELECTION - YOUR GOTO RANGE FOR A GREAT LOOKING VENUE.

By selecting a number of different stools from our vintage range - namely the Seaton, Adelaide, School bar stool and Trenton low stool - the designers have provided visual variety while maintaining a harmonic vintage blend.

Developed over many years, our vintage range has everything from bar stools, to benches and even retail display pieces. The breadth of the range means complementary products such as the Weardale coffee table make instant and great value companion pieces. FLEMISH OAK ALTAR PIECE

Mid 19th century Flemish oak altar piece. With intricate Fleur de Lys and qua trefoil carvings to the frontage this would make an impressive statement piece as a shop counter or bar fitting.

EDWARDIAN JEWELLER'S CABINET

Edwardian mahogany framed double bow ended display cabinet, featuring a nine drawer base with curved cupboard doors, the upper section supported by turned columns has double bow ended panels with a central glass panel flanked by doors, accessing an interior with three adjustable glass shelves (two full length, one short) and a full mirrored back.



19TH CENTURY MAHOGANY DOOR

Early 19th century mahogany six panel door with Tudor style arched top, incorporating carved architrave and recessed panelled casing. Rob not included.

An antique Rococo style mahogany screens, featuring scrolled foliate decorative panels, broken swan-neck pediments with crests to the two ends and a full run of linen-fold decorative panels below. The screen has three open panels, and the incorporation of mirrors would further enhance an already exceptional piece. This beautiful screen with lots of potential would make an out-standing back bar unit, especially by utilising the linen-fold base as a counter front.





ST. TROPEZ

An ultra-contemporary outdoor woven collection with a curved back and thin metal legs. Features a powder coated aluminium frame, anthracite webbing and grey cushion. The cushion is only suitable for use outdoor.

Featuring a bar stool, lounge chair, armchair and two seat sofa.





A comfortable outdoor lounge collection which features a fine texture black powder-coated boxy frame with grey cushions which are only suitable for use outdoor.

"The late Malcolm McLaren, infamously infamous Sex Pistols manager and inimitable provocateur, once famously quipped, "Being fearless of failure arms you to break the rules. In doing so, you may change the culture and just possibly, for a moment, change life itself." That, of course, was back when culture actually still believed it could change the world.

At 6-7 Denmark Street in Soho, London, the groundwork was indeed laid for the culture (and arguably pretty much everything else) to be changed, when Malcolm rented it as the Pistols' rehearsal and living space — and obviously, nothing would ever be the same once the pioneering punk quartet was unleashed upon an unsuspecting, and genuinely horrified public. Owing to that distinction, in 2016 the building was granted Grade II listed status. Punk became a heritage."- BlackBook Magazine
